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

From October 25th, 2017 through January 20th, 2018, Photo12 Galerie is pleased and excited to present Kacper Kowalski's first solo exhibition in France.

Over is a series of aerial photographs taken from a gyroplane flying over the Polish countryside during the winter. Kacper Kowalski has been an aviation enthusiast for more than 20 years, in particular by means of paragliders and gyroplanes, and is part of a tradition of aerial photography initiated by Edward Burtynsky, George Gerster, George Steinmetz and Yann Arthus-Bertrand, although Kowalski has quickly emerged with his own language.

Capturing immaculate landscapes, the photographer operates as an architect of visual formation, systematically searching and graphing the landscape's precise lines, leading him to a form of abstraction.

In the depth of winter

With *Over*, Kacper Kowalski explores the depths of winter and puts the viewer face-to-face to nature in its sleep. The omnipresence of snow transforms the landscapes into immaculate vast expanses of white where the horizon ends up drifting into the sky.

Alone in front of this nature, the viewer is thus confronted with a moment who presence reminds him of the ephemeral nature of the world. The universe belongs to no one.

The ground, covered with snow, helps create photographic compositions of the landscape in black and white. Some traces of life seem to pierce the blanket and rare shades of ochres try to emerge, crystallizing the presence of an artificial world.

Objects and their reflections

The concentration of the photographed elements—whether vegetable, mineral, or artificial (roads, dwellings, metallic structures)—creates sets of shapes that take us away from the real object.

Desaturation then helps unearth an atmosphere at once strange and peaceful withing the photographs. The shapes, their reflections, and their shadows underline the symmetries and create compositions that tend towards abstraction, and subtlety permeates the entire series.



Artist's Statement

"The snow on the floor reminds me of the icing that is put on an overcooked cake. Or a wave that covering all the traces, objects, and constructions that men and other creatures have left behind. It forms and disappears. For a brief moment, it erases all traces of life from the surface of the Earth. Like an eternity ... it begins again and again.

Shortly after the snow has fallen, when the clouds have not yet retreated, the world does not belong to men. The world belongs to nobody. A different order and rhythm then compose it. When I fly over this no man's land I feel like watching an unknown planet. I cannot see any trace of life or any sign of human presence. I look around me, looking for the slightest clue.

Hello? Is there anyone here? Imagine the humans have left the Earth. When did they leave and where? Why? What is left now and how long will it last? "

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Kacper Kowalski — biography



Kacper Kowalski © ??? Born in 1977, Kacper Kowalski shoots aerial photographs of urban and natural environments. He is a graduate of the Technical University of Gdańsk, where he studied architecture. After having worked in architecture for four years, he devoted himself entirely to flying and photography. Both as a pilot and a photographer, he takes aerial pictures of natural and urban environments of his native Poland.

Kowalski shoots his images while flying in either a paraglider or open-hull gyrocopter. The photographer pilots these crafts himself, typically while flying at heights around 500 ft above the ground. By self-piloting and flying at heights lower than typically used in aerial photography, Kowalski enables himself to find images in the process of flying rather than conceiving of a shot and using flight to capture it.

He has received numerous awards, including the World Press Photo award (2009, 2014, 2015), the Picture of the Year International POYi award (2012, 2014, 2015, 2016), and many others. His work has been featured in the publications Conde Nast Traveler, Juxtapoz Magazine, New York Magazine, The New York Times, and many more. His first photography book, Side Effects, was published in early 2014. Photographs from this project are shown all over the world. He lives and works in Gdynia, Poland. This is his first solo exhibition in France.


