Through behind the scenes images and insightful anecdotes, she unveils the collaborative spirit that binds directors, actors, production designers, and crew members together. In her reflections on Fargo, Gaffin captures not only the creative genius of icons like Roger Deakins but also the playful chaos orchestrated by the Coen brothers. Amidst the staging of murder mysteries and the challenges of Minnesota's unforgiving winters, her own struggles back home in California serve as a poignant reminder that career triumphs do not shield one from the realities of life.





While navigating the demands of production, including deadlines, budgets, politics, and the turmoil of family life, Gaffin's photography remains a steadfast beacon of inspiration. Viewed through a lens that is both professional and personal, her work transcends mere documentation of films, emerging instead as a heartfelt tribute to the art of moviemaking and the transformative power of photography. As Britt Salvesen aptly describes *Moving Still*, it is "so much more than an illustrated filmography. It is a loving tribute to moviemaking and photography and a reflective account of self-discovery."


"This is a visual diary of my thirty-five years as a Photographer and Set Decorator for feature films. It's also, almost accidentally, a

Lauri Gaffin (b. 1951, Los Angeles) is a set decorator and photographer with four decades in the film industry, contributing to Fargo, The Pursuit of Happiess, Six Days Seven Nights, The Ring II,



Charlie's Angels, Iron Man, Thor, and Captain Marvel. In Moving Still, she reflects on her artistic process and the intersection of creativity, collaboration, and personal experience. She earned a BA in Photography at UCLA, studying with Robert Heinecken, Peter Goulds, Rita Yokoi, and Shirley Clarke, and an MFA at CalArts in 1977 under John Baldessari and Lucas Samaras, also working with Laurie Anderson, John Mandel, Mike Kelley, and Douglas Huebler. Her photographs have been exhibited at Harris & Ruble Art and are part of the permanent collection of the Los Angeles County Museum of Art.
